Summary of PPG spending 2018/19

Objectives in spending PPG:

To ensure all PP children close the attainment gap, if any exists, and reach or exceed age related expectations.

Summary of spending and actions taken:

- Small, teacher led group work in years 2, 5 and 6 to maximise access and attainment at end of Key Stage.
- Set teaching wherever possible across the school.
- Bespoke 1:1 interventions across KS1 and KS2 to support maths, reading and writing, boosting self-esteem and helping pupils achieve or exceed age related expectations.
- Enrichment opportunities for LAC to participate in residential and educational visits.

- Puzzle club provision for children who find lunchtimes difficult.
- Uniform provided for PP children.
- After school and breakfast club paid for PP children

Impact of pupil premium funding 2018/19

The personalised interventions and skilled teacher and TA Support in the Early Years, KS1 and early KS2 build the foundations and learning skills required to enable children to make accelerated progress in Years 5 & 6.

As a result, a higher percentage of Pupil Premium children at Middleton achieved a scaled score of 100+ than all pupils nationally in every subject.

Teacher assessed writing	100%	78%
Reading/writing/maths combined	100%	65%

Historically 100% of Middleton pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium Funding have achieved age related expectations or above, in all core subjects, at the end of KS2 for the last six years.
