- ★ Capital letters for the start of sentence, names, personal pronouns.

To inform - Information Text

Text Structure

- ★ Ideas grouped together for similarity with some use of subheadings.
- * Written in the present tense.
- * Begin to use formal and technical vocabulary.

- ★ Use spaces to separate words.
- ★ Begin to use full stops.
- ★ Begin to use exclamation marks.

To Inform - A Recount

Text Structure

- ★ Written in first person.
- ★ Written in the past tense.
- ★ Focused on individual or group participants, e.g. I, we.
- ★ An introduction which answers who, when, where and why?

- ★ Simple connectives are used to construct simple sentences, e.g. and, but, then, so.
- ★ Use of time adverbs e.g first, next, then etc.

Punctuation

- ★ Use spaces to separate words.
- ★ Begin to use full stops.
- ★ Begin to use exclamation marks.
- ★ Capital letters for the start of sentence, names, personal pronouns.
- * Read words with contractions.

To Inform - Non-Chronological Report

Text Structure

- ★ Ideas grouped together for similarity.
- * Attempts at third person writing. e.g. The man was run over.
- ★ Written in the appropriate tense. e.g. Sparrow's nest... Dinosaurs were...
- ★ Use of a title and subheadings

Sentence Types

- ★ Simple connectives are used to construct simple sentences, e.g. and, but, then, so.
- ★ Subject specific language and the use of facts.

<u>Punctuation</u>

- ★ Use spaces to separate words.
- ★ Begin to use full stops.
- * Begin to use exclamation marks.
- ★ Capital letters for the start of sentence, names, personal pronouns.
- ★ Read words with contractions.

To Persuade - Persuasive Leaflet (Ice Planet)

Text Structure

- ★ Written in present tense.
- ★ Written in first person
- ★ May include a picture of the item and a caption.

Sentence Types

- ★ Rhetorical questions e.g. Do you want to be the most relaxed person in town? Do you want to be the coolest kid in your class?
- ★ Includes facts.
- ★ Powerful verbs and adverbs.
- ★ Effective use of noun phrases to create persuasive devices e.g. delicious chocolate.

Punctuation

- ★ Use spaces to separate words.
- ★ Begin to use full stops.
- * Begin to use exclamation marks.
- ★ Capital letters for the start of sentence, names, personal pronouns.
- * Read words with contractions.
